Acton 250th committee: preparation for 8/26 meeting

For the publicity discussion, Bob will work on some ideas for a poster that will include multiple 250th events, probably to the end of 2024. One idea was to display relevant Acton Library events on the poster, as well.

Scheduling future articles and other programming.

It was agreed to keep focusing on what was happening in 1774. The first piece will be Larry Kerpelman's two articles on the plight of the Loyalists, to be scheduled for publication in *Action Unlimited* in August. Our committee has already reviewed them, and Bob suggested that we offer to send them in ourselves. The next article will be Mary Fuhrer's announcement and general article on Crown Resistance Day, 1774—hopefully right after Labor Day, once we give it a final review. Pam's article on taverns (still to be reviewed) will be next.

250th website review.

The status of the website was briefly discussed, and it was noted that with all the lengthy articles that are now there it is turning into a valuable source of information for the future. It was

suggested that we and the 250th committee look for a way to capture that content, along with the published articles, in some permanent form—possibly as an online scrapbook of some sort.

With that in mind, it was agreed that we should add the first 5/26 event at Jones Tavern and Faulkner House in the “Still Here” series to the website even after the fact. Anne will forward the notice to the Publicity Committee.

Other future planning.

Events. Continuing the discussion last time regarding Black history month, Anne proposed to gather the recent research from several sources on Patriot of Color John Oliver and his family and see about putting together a presentation for February.
