

TOWN MANAGER'S UPDATE

FY2026 Operating and Capital Budget Process Update

During their February 24th meeting, the Select Board voted to approve the Town Manager's proposed budget for transmission to the Finance Committee. This budget is a reduction from the original proposed level services budget and aims to continue providing much needed services to the community. A large driver of increases continues to be health insurance rates. This has required the Town to take creative budgeting approaches to absorb this increase within the budget. DPW Project Update


On February 12th, the DPW Building Committee (DPWBC) held a public meeting in room 204 at Town Hall. During the meeting, the DPWBC reviewed current design and value engineering options with the project designer Weston & Sampson. The DPWBC identified additional reductions to the square footage and overall scope of the project that resulted in an estimated reduction of \$6,800,000 to the total project cost. At this point, the project team estimates the total project cost will be \$40 million. Weston & Sampson are finalizing the 40% design package then submitting to a construction cost estimator to review and provide accurate estimates. The DPWBC and Town anticipate having the updated total project cost estimate by Friday, March 28th. The Next DPWBC meeting is scheduled for April 2nd where the updated estimate will be discussed. Update on 17 Woodbury Lane Renovations

As you may know, the Town has received funding secured by Congresswoman Lori Trahan from the Federal Housing and Urban Development Department, allocated ARPA funds, and received funding awards by the Community Preservation Committee to undertake renovations to 17 Woodbury Lane. This building, located behind Town Hall on the Town Hall/Library Campus, has fallen into disrepair and in need of renovations. Through this project, the building will be renovated into a space that will be available for the community to rent and hold meetings, events, programs and host outdoor activities. This space will provide seating for up to 75 people and a covered porch that will provide a perfect location for residents and Town Departments to host events. 

TIPS FOR BATTERY DISPOSAL

Batteries NEVER go in the recycling bin, and some types can't go in the trash either—they are a major cause of fires at sorting facilities. Only single-use alkaline batteries can go in the trash. Nickel-Cadmium Rechargeable Batteries, Button Batteries and Lithium Batteries can be recycled at the Acton Transfer Station. Small Lithium Ion, Nickel-Cadmium, and Lead Acid Batteries (no button cells) can be recycled at Town Hall.






