## TOWN MANAGER'S UPDATE

### Acton Designated as a Climate Leader

In early May, I was honored to attend a ceremony hosted by the Healey-Driscoll Administration that announced Acton and other communities as the first Climate Leader communities in the Commonwealth. This designation is a reflection of the countless hours dedicated by Town leaders and staff, board members and community volunteers in addressing climate change and securing a healthier environment. This designation is another step towards achieving net-zero emissions by 2030 as directed by the town's Climate Emergency Declaration passed at Town Meeting in 2020.

## Annual Town Meeting Recap

On May 5th and 6th, residents attended the two day Annual Town Meeting. During the sessions, voters held lively discussions on the DPW Building Project next steps, annual operating budgets, proposed Community Preservation Act projects, a number of citizen petitions, proposed capital improvement projects, gas leaf blower bylaw proposal, and zoning bylaws aimed at protecting open space, and providing accessible, affordable housing for all. I am grateful for the continued engagement and guidance from Town Meeting attendees, volunteers serving on the numerous boards and committees, Select Board members, and the dedicated Town and School professionals who support the Annual Town Meeting each year. ## POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Acton Police Department's Citizens Police Academy is an excellent opportunity for community members to gain insight into local law enforcement operations.

The 2025 session took place over eight weeks, from April 2 to May 21, 2025, at the Public Safety Facility on Main Street. Participants explored various topics, including patrol procedures, traffic enforcement, use of force, drug investigations, dispatch operations, domestic violence, mental health issues, criminal investigations, juvenile justice, restorative justice, prosecution, and criminal.

The department plans to offer another session in the fall of 2026. While specific dates and registration details have not been announced yet, please watch our social media for upcoming events.

These academies are designed to familiarize citizens with the operations and functions of the Acton Police Department. Participants often engage in ride-a-longs, observe demonstrations, and learn about various aspects of law enforcement, fostering a deeper understanding and building stronger community-police relationships.
