Kelley's Corner Infrastructure Project Update



The project is entering its final phase! Work on roads, sidewalks, and temporary pavement markings is starting this month. Construction will be substantially completed this winter. Thank you for your continued patience as the state works to finish this multi-year project!

Changes to Acton Power Choice

Recent impacts to the electricity supply market have resulted in unexpected impacts to rates. As part of these changes, the Acton Power Choice program will be adjusting the amount of additional electricity supplied from new renewable energy sources. Currently, this program utilizes 45% electricity from new renewable energy sources. In an effort to maintain the current rate of the APC program, the Select Board voted to reduce the percentage of additional electricity supplied by these renewable sources to 23%. While this change is not ideal, it ensures rates do not increase and the program continues to utilize renewable energy sources. If you are interested in the Acton Power Choice Green option, which provides electricity that is 100% from new, Northeast renewable sources, you can opt up here: MassPowerChoice.com/Acton/opt-up. 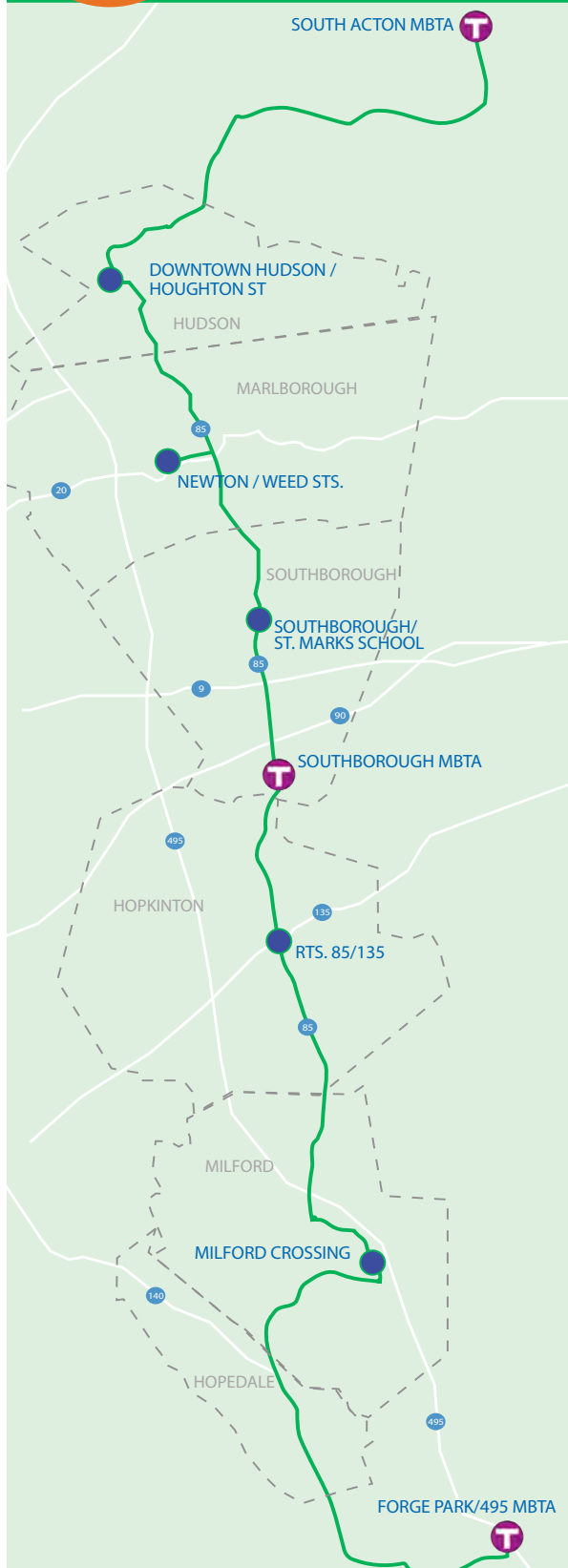



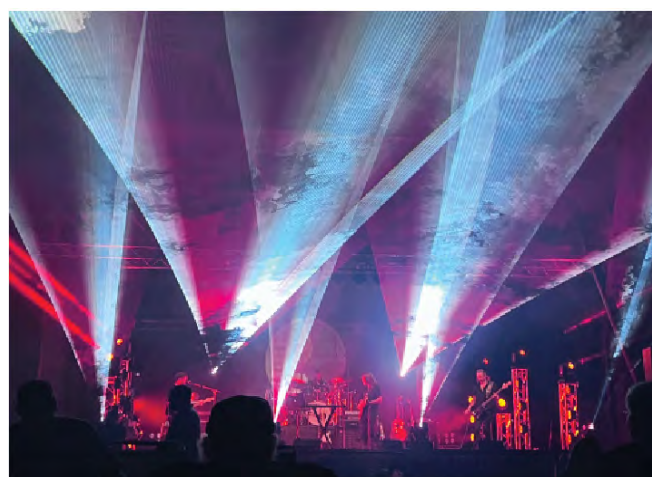
