TOWN MANAGER'S UPDATE

The Town Manager's Recommended Fiscal Year 2027 Municipal Operating Budget has been published online at www.actonma.gov/manager.

The proposed municipal budget represents a 3.25% increase over the prior year. The budget maximizes available resources through efficiency measures and external funding. Over the past seven years, Acton has secured more than \$23 million in competitive grants, enabling priority infrastructure projects and innovative programs. Cost-saving strategies include reorganizations, regional collaborations, and leveraging special funds to help us provide services with limited resources.

The Capital Plan for FY2027 prioritizes the revised design for the Department of Public Works Facility and replacement of Town Hall HVAC and emergency power systems. These projects will use multiple funding sources, including state grants and surplus funds, to reduce financial impact. The DPW facility redesign proposes renovating the existing building for fleet storage and constructing a new facility for mechanics, offices, and workshops, reducing square footage and costs.

I look forward to presenting the budget on January 12th and the department presentations at the Select Board/Finance Committee workshops on January 20th and 21st.

TOWN MANAGER'S UPDATE

The Town is beginning preparations for Independence Day 2026 and to pay special tribute to the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. We will be collaborating with members of the Acton 250 Committee to plan the event. Our office has been receiving questions about the Select Board's recent decision not to include fireworks funding in the FY27 budget and to not have fireworks at the 2026 Independence Day celebration.

The popularity of the fireworks had made the celebration into a regional event with limited local benefit to justify the solely local investment. As a community, we had to invest taxpayer funds, significant time, and several critical public resources to put on this event. For the past three years, Town Meeting has appropriated \$40K to fund a portion of the costs of implementing the 4th of July Independence Day celebration. The total cost is closer to \$60K when considering staff costs, overtime, performance costs, signage, bathrooms, fireworks, shuttle buses, and other expenses associated with providing the fireworks celebration. A fireworks celebration requires significant staffing from Police, Fire, DPW, Technology, Dispatch, Recreation, and staff from many other town departments. Planning for the regional event begins in the winter and requires regular meetings and coordination efforts leading up to the event. The setup begins weeks beforehand to prepare the area for an influx of 10K + attendees in a six hour period. Breakdown often continues into the next week to fully dismantle and return rented equipment.

The change is meant to focus on providing more of an event for Acton residents to celebrate the 250th instead of an event for the region centered around fireworks. Acton has a rich history in the American Revolution which has been highlighted the past few years by the Acton 250 Committee. The 2026 event is an opportunity for Acton residents to celebrate the rich history of Acton and its role in the history of the United States. The \$40k in funding appropriated last year is still available and can be used for fireworks at a future July 4th event. That funding will not be used this year for the reasons described above. 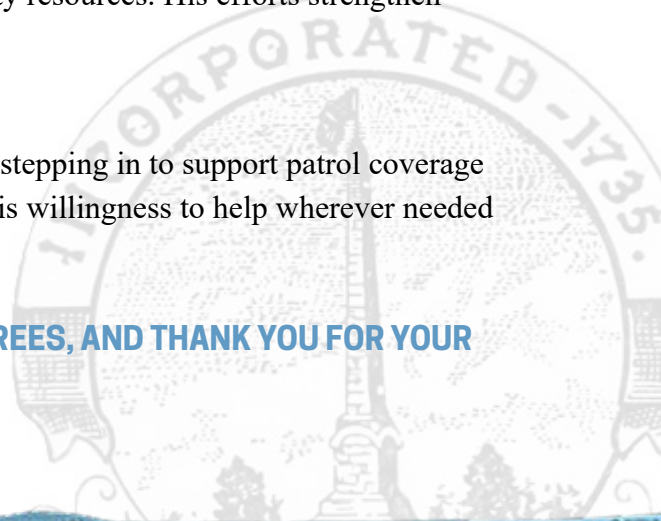
BRIAN SMITH (FIRE DEPARTMENT)

VOLUNTEERING OPPORTUNITY

The Office of Economic Development is offering a volunteer opportunity for students interested in supporting a survey project in partnership with the Economic Development Committee (EDC). REMINDER TO BUSINESS OWNERS: FORM OF LIST FILING REQUIRED

Business owners are required to complete and return a Form of List to the Assessor's Office. The form details tangible business assets such as machinery, equipment, furniture, and other physical items used in your day-to-day operations. The assessment is done each year based on the value of these items as of January 1 and the annual filing deadline is March 1. Filing on time helps you avoid penalty fees and preserves your right to appeal the assessed value, if needed.

SUSTAINABILITY

SIGN UP FOR A NO-COST ENERGY ASSESSMENT

Hey, Acton! All homeowners and renters in 1-4 unit buildings are eligible for a free Home Energy Assessment from Mass Save **every two years**. During the assessment, a Mass Save-approved contractor will evaluate your home's heating and cooling systems, insulation, appliances, and more-- at no cost to you. After the assessment, you will receive a detailed report outlining energy-saving opportunities, and you will have the choice to move forward with any recommended upgrades and available incentives. Many households also receive free energy-saving devices during the visit, such as smart thermostats or faucet aerators!

The Town of Acton invites members of the Acton community to participate in a focus group and share their experiences, perspectives, and ideas. These small-group conversations will help **inform future town efforts related to health, well-being, and equity**. 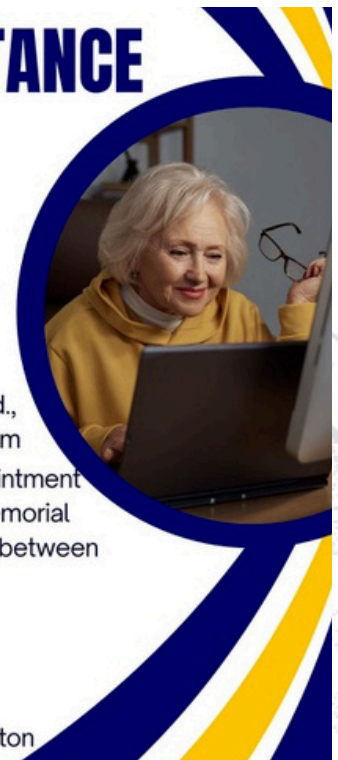

Senior Safety Tips: Stay Safe and Warm This Winter!

Preparation is key! Take action to keep you safe from the following risks this winter.

Stay Safe Walking on Ice

Stay safe on icy walkways by wearing non-slip footwear, taking small slow steps, and using handrails or assistive devices for extra stability. Keep sand or salt on hand.

Hire help if you need it and are able, to make your paths safer and easier to manage.



Use Caution: Limited Visibility & Daylight Hours

Improve visibility by using light or motion-sensor porch lights, keeping a flashlight in your car, and using your phone's flashlight when needed. Plan your outings to avoid driving in the dark whenever possible.



Protect Yourself from Getting Sick

- Get vaccinated for respiratory illnesses
- Stay home when you are sick
- Wear a mask in crowded places
- Wash your hands frequently

Many viruses spread more during the holiday season, so it is important to get all recommended vaccines, including flu, COVID-19 and RSV, as soon as possible.



Stay Warm – Stay Safe

Keep your home safe and warm by keeping up with furnace and chimney maintenance, clearing outdoor vents, and using space heaters with plenty of space around them. Routinely check fuel supply levels.

Remember to check your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors routinely to ensure they have fresh batteries.

What to do During a Storm

If you can, stay home during a storm. Make plans ahead of time to stay with family or friends. Check in with neighbors while keeping an eye on weather and power updates.

Try to avoid driving on icy or messy roads, and reach out for help anytime you need it.



Be Prepared for Power Outages

Being prepared for power outages during a storm will help you stay safe, warm, and comfortable until power is restored.

- Keep extra warm clothing and blankets
- Use generators safely (outdoors / proper ventilation)
- Keep chargers and flashlights with fresh batteries
- Have a two-week supply of prescription medicines
- Keep extra food on hand such as canned soups, water, and crackers

It is important to stock over-the-counter medicines and electrolyte drinks (e.g., cold medicines, Pedialyte, water, Gatorade).

Mental Health & Isolation During Cold Months

Staying mentally well through the cold months matters, so make a point to stay connected by calling, texting, or video chatting with friends and family.

- Get daylight exposure daily (lightboxes, exercise)
- Drop by the Senior Center for social time
- Seek help if feeling lonely or depressed

If you start feeling lonely or down, try calming techniques like meditation or box breathing.

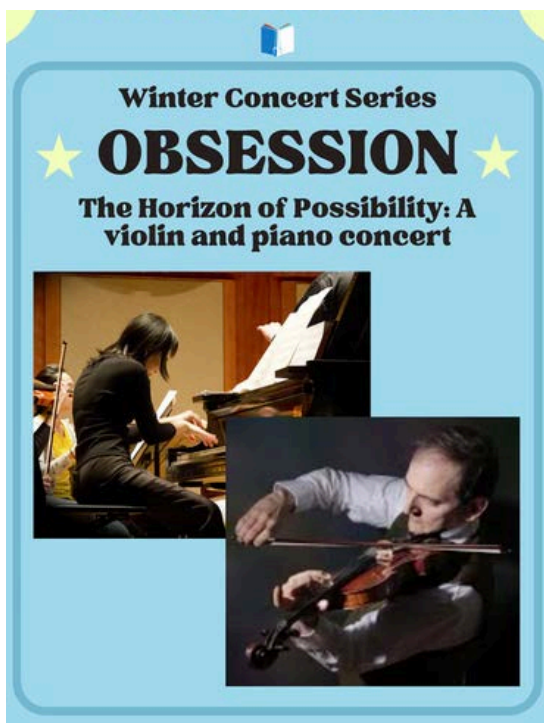

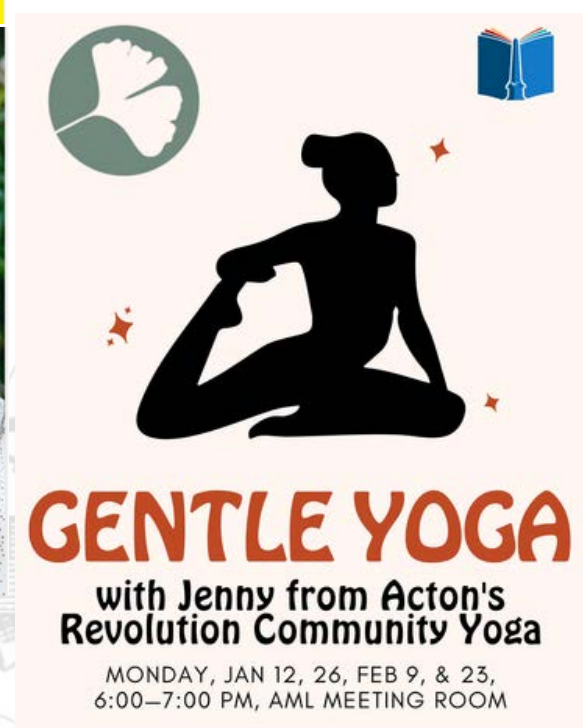
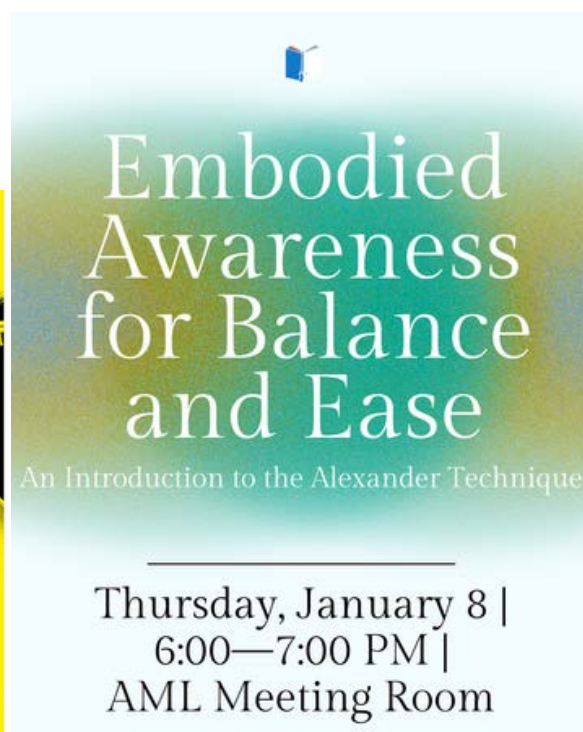

NEW SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER

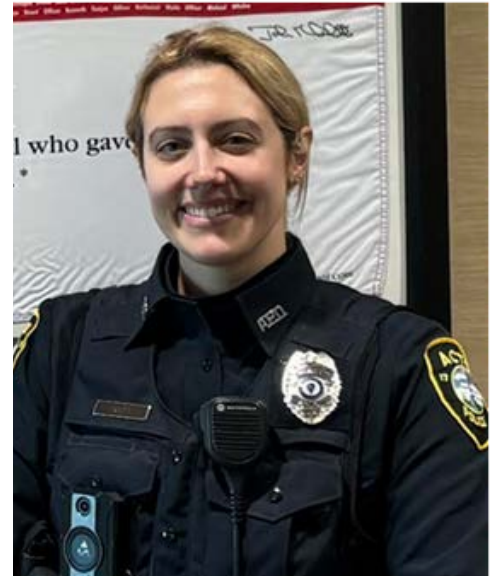
Chief James Cogan is pleased to announce that Acton Police Det. Monica Ricci has been appointed as the department's newest School Resource Officer (SRO).

Det. Ricci will be assigned to the elementary schools along with two collaborative schools. As SRO, Det. Ricci will maintain a safe and secure environment at the schools and during special events. She will provide counsel and guidance to school administrators regarding school safety, build positive relationships with students and staff and provide safety presentations and programs.

Det. Ricci has nine years of experience in law enforcement and has been a member of the Acton Police Department since 2023. She holds a bachelor's degree in criminal justice from the University of Massachusetts, Boston, and a master's degree in forensic psychology from Southern New Hampshire University.

Not new to working with schools, Ricci previously worked in the Tufts University Police Department, where she participated in proactive crime prevention and community policing.

DO YOUR "DOODY" TO KEEP OUR LOCAL WATERS CLEAN

You hate stepping in it. Fish hate swimming in it. Dogs produce a lot of waste which, if not disposed of properly, can end up in our waterways.

HOW YOU CAN HELP

- Always bring a pet waste bag when you walk your pet
- Scoop the poop! Pick up after your pet
- Properly dispose of pet waste by putting it in the trash
- Never throw pet waste into a storm drain or waterway



WHAT'S THE PROBLEM WITH PET WASTE?

Pet waste contains germs and bacteria that can be harmful to human health and to our waterways and can even cause algae to grow. Water with increased bacteria and algae can have serious, and sometimes fatal, consequences for aquatic life, humans, and our pets.

Rainfall and snowmelt in Acton flow untreated into our stormwater system, then directly into local streams, ponds, rivers, and lakes. As it flows, stormwater picks up contaminants and pollutants like bacteria and germs from pet waste. Violations of Acton Chapter U, which regulates discharges to the municipal storm drain system, will result in criminal penalties listed in the general bylaws of the Town of Acton.



By properly disposing of pet waste, you are keeping our environment and our community happy and healthy.

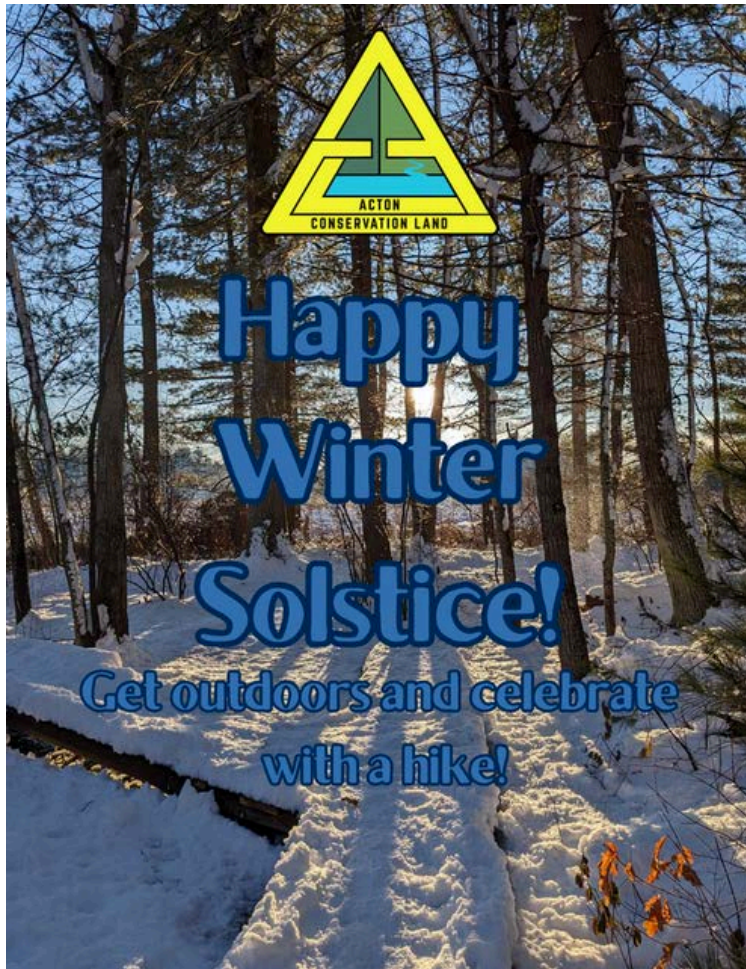
