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## TOWN MANAGER'S UPDATE

After over a year of extensive community feedback, including virtual webinars and listening sessions, workshops, comprehensive analysis, and a festival, the final Climate Action Plan is published! This document provides a strategic framework for reducing greenhouse gas emissions and building community resilience against climate change, with a guide to assist Acton in achieving its goal of net-zero emissions. The Town also partnered with the Acton-Boxborough Regional School District to develop an Electrification Roadmap, which outlines the capital, operational, and conversion costs for electrifying the top-seven energy-consuming municipal and school buildings. Thanks to Sustainability Director Becerra for her leadership during this very important process.

On July 11th, the Select Board voted unanimously to accept the report regarding the creation of Acton's first Diversity Officer. After six months of study with extensive community input and stakeholder engagement, the final report identifies a recommended structure and organizational placement for the position that is funded in the current FY23 budget. Thanks to the efforts of the UMass Boston Collins Center for their work preparing this report, as well as the town staff, volunteer board and committee members, and the public for their participation in this initiative. The West Acton Citizens' Library currently has an open seat on the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees and the Select Board will be meeting later this month in a joint meeting to discuss and vote on appointing a new Trustee. Any parties interested in filling the current vacancy are encouraged to send a letter of interest to the Town Managers' Office no later than August 8, 2022. The Economic Development Office has hit the ground running supporting our local business community. Director Pierce Onos successfully received a \$66,500 grant from the 495/MetroWest Partnership to create the Acton Business Incubator, or "ABI," which will support start-ups and existing businesses' efforts to survive and grow. ABI will provide technical assistance, micro-grants, and signage for participating businesses. ABI's first set of programming will be hosting a three-part webinar on "How the Art of Public Speaking Can Help Grow Your Business." ### Steve Dimeco, Firefighter / EMT

Chief Robert Hart is pleased to announce the 2022 Joseph A. Lalli Merit Award recipient for Public Safety Employee of the Year is Firefighter / EMT Steve Dimeco.

Steve has served in the fire service for more than 22 years. His career started with the Lancaster call Fire Department in January 2000 then joining the Clinton call Fire Department in 2005 where he eventually joined the Acton Fire Department in July of 2007. Prior to joining the Acton Fire Department, he completed his EMT training and became certified as an open water SCUBA diver in 2003. He has attended many academy courses as well as working for the academy for many years.

In 2008, Steve graduated from the Massachusetts Firefighting Academy Recruit class #181 and is certified in Firefighter 1 and 2, Fire officer 1 and Instructor 1. He holds a CDL-B license along with a class 2A hoisting license

Steve is extremely helpful in the daily efforts in the department. His responsibilities include assisting with the maintenance and repairs of the fire Department's equipment and facilities. He is a current member of the Training Division and continues to show leadership attributes by training new recruits on rescue techniques, specifically Rapid intervention teams commonly known as RIT, along with fire suppression tactics and strategies. He seeks out structures in town that we can use as training platforms, procuring all necessary DEP approvals for the department to train in a live fire scenario, and coordinates all aspects of the live burn day activities. His passion for teaching the art of firefighting is contagious and we are grateful to have such a mentor on our team.

Firefighter Dimeco continues to show courage, skill, and compassion for the Acton Fire Department members as well as the citizens of Acton.



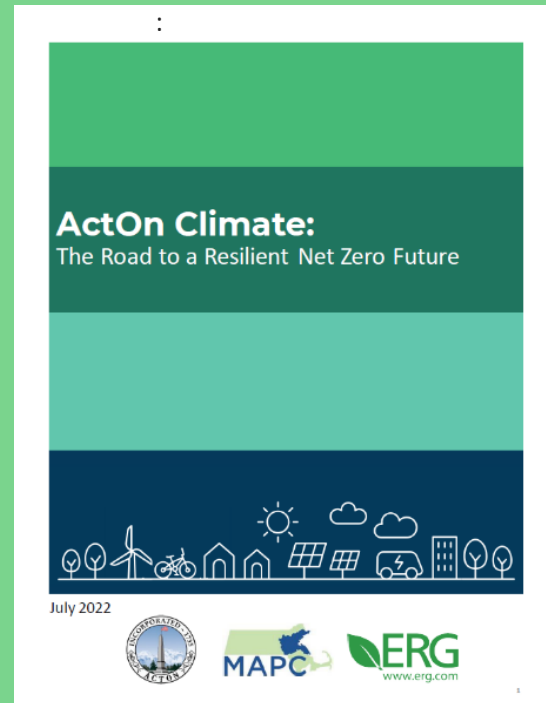

**Whether this is your first time meditating or you want to deepen your practice, join Erin LoPorto for this 8-week program.**

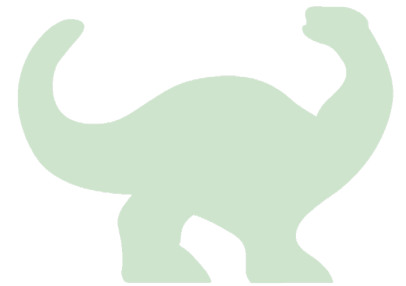
