TOWN MANAGER'S UPDATE

Thank you to everyone that attended the 2023 Annual Town Meeting that started on May 1st. We had 556 voters the first night and 383 the second night. The meeting concluded in the early morning hour of May 3rd as the last article was taken up after midnight. I was pleased to be able to present the Joseph A. Lalli Merit Awards to two dedicated employees during the second night of Annual Town Meeting. Acton Memorial Library Office Manager Mary Katis was selected as the Municipal Employee of the Year. Katis was honored for providing leadership and support during several transitions in the library administration over the last year. Acton Fire Department Firefighter Paramedic Josh Ramos was selected as the Public Safety Employee of the Year. Firefighter Ramos was off-duty when he noticed a fire at a senior housing complex in Maynard, and voluntarily entered the building to help ensure all residents were evacuating. On April 26th the Select Board celebrated the recipients of the Colonel Francis Faulkner Sr. Award for Exemplary Volunteer Service at a reception at the Acton Memorial Library. TOWN MANAGER'S UPDATE CONTINUED

On April 28th we held an Arbor day celebration at the Goward Playground behind the Acton Memorial Library. We had a great turnout at the Arbor Day event with DPW and other town departments. There was story time, tree sapling giveaway and a new sugar maple tree that was planted near the playground.

Have you seen the new signs on the rail trail? Come explore the Bruce Freeman Rail Trail and the great businesses on Great Road! The Town took part in the State's Local Rapid Recovery Plan Program in 2021 focusing on the Great Road Corridor, which identified implementation of a Bruce Freeman Rail Trail Wayfinding program as a top priority project. The goal of this project is to connect riders to the many local businesses on Great Road that runs parallel to the trail and encourage exploration of Acton's cultural assets. The Town applied and was awarded a grant from the Massachusetts Office of Travel and Tourism for design, fabrication and installation in 2022. We are happy to announce the signs are now installed!

We continue to have staffing transitions in Town Hall. In April we welcomed our new Building Commissioner Ed Mullen and said good bye to Director of Intergovernmental Affairs Austin Cyganiewicz. Austin made a big impact in this community over the last three years and we wish him the best in his new role as Town Administrator for the Town of Rutland.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT LIBRARIAN | ACTON MEMORIAL LIBRARY

The Town of Acton is seeking candidates for the Community Engagement Librarian. This is a professional full-time, benefitted, 40-hour work week position with significant responsibilities for library programs and services; including outreach to different community groups, and knowledge of current trends in libraries and library technology. They will report to Acton Memorial Library and report to the Head of Information Services.

General Duties and Responsibilities: This position is responsible for library programs for adults and young adults (ages 13-18) which includes designing, implementing, and evaluating of such programs. Manages library publicity; which includes creating content for social media, posters, flyers, routine press releases, brochures, handouts for library programs, and more. This position will perform outreach to the community of Acton, seek out public speaking opportunities to engage with the community and collaborate with other Town departments and community/area organizations. Coordinates staff off-site outreach activities such as Farmers Market, Employee Day, Health Fair, etc. Teach technology classes, explain library policies and procedures to the public, and fill in regularly at the library service desks as needed. Contribute to collection development projects and act as a member of the library's various committees; including the programming committee and attend monthly meetings. Perform any other tasks and similar duties require similar levels of skills and responsibility as needed per requests from the library administration.

Minimum Entrance Requirements: ALA-Accredited Master's degree in Library Science plus the equivalent of a two (2) years of full-time experience in a fully automated public library. Library program and publicity experience; experience working with and troubleshooting common library technologies; experience working with diverse populations; demonstrated knowledge of current trends in library technology; excellent organization and interpersonal skills.

Preferred Qualifications: Additional relevant library experience, and fluency in a language in addition to English.

LOCAL BUILDING INSPECTOR | BUILDING DEPARTMENT

The Town of Acton is seeking a full time Local Building Inspector reporting to the Building Commissioner in the Building Department. Acton is a vibrant community with approximately 1400 building permits issued per year.

General Duties and Responsibilities: Prepares daily work schedule, conducts and logs various activities, assists at the service counter, communicates with citizens and contractors, schedules appointments both internally and externally, and prepares letters. Reviews plans on all approved permitted projects. Communicates laws, technical requirements, ordinances of the appropriate model codes from builders, contractors, subcontractors, individual homeowners, design professionals. Inspects places for compliance with statutes. Issues stop work orders on projects and coordinates work with other departments and Town staff. Responds to emergencies and may represent the Building Commissioner at public meetings or in office in his absence. Performs other duties as required.

Minimum Entrance Requirements: Valid Drivers License. High School diploma or equivalency. Minimum of five (5) years' experience in supervision of building construction or design or at least a two (2) year associates degree in field related to building construction or design or any combination of education and experience. Must be qualified by the MA BBRS per 780 CMR ch110.R7.

Preferred Qualifications: Proven interpersonal, oral, and written communication skills; ability to effectively interact and communicate with individuals of diverse backgrounds. Ability to operate office equipment as demonstrated by previous work experience. Basic knowledge of principles of government regulation and the ability to read, interpret, apply, and communicate Town charter, to perform the essential duties of this position..

Special Requirements: Physical activities include frequently lifting, pushing, pulling, and carrying objects weighing up to 50 pounds with or without assistance. Work is performed outdoors, exposed to adverse weather conditions.

1. This program provides Acton households with short-term financial assistance for emergency needs using grant funding from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). The Community Services Office is available to answer any questions and help with completing the application
2. This program is intended to provide emergency assistance for rent, mortgage, utilities(electric, natural gas, oil or propane) and childcare.
3. Childcare grants can be used at any Department of Early Education and Care (DEEC) licensed programs, NARA summer camp, Boys and Girls Club of Assabet Valley and Acton Boxborough Community Education.
4. The program will provide a grant of up to a total of \$1,000 in a twelve-month period.
5. Where this program has a rolling timeframe, assistance will be awarded on a first come first served basis. However, the Town reserves the right to alter that basis for exigent circumstances.
6. Once approved, the funds will be paid directly to the vendor (e.g., landlord, utility company etc.) and not the applicant.

The Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) helps eligible households pay water and sewer bills to restore or maintain access to drinking water and wastewater services and is funded through two federal appropriations.

You become eligible for LIHWAP after being approved for Fuel Assistance (LIHEAP). You do not need to complete a separate application.



SPRING REPAIRS

Sometimes the grass strips and curbs along the roads are damaged while plowing. The Highway Division works to repair these areas as soon as possible after the snow has melted and the ground has thawed; however other work that involves the safety of the public takes priority. It may take until mid-summer to repair these areas. The repair of grass surfaces generally consists of raking out the ruts and seeding with a standard highway grass seed. If your landscaping needs are such that this is unacceptable, you may choose to repair these areas on your own earlier in the spring.


The Swap Shop allows users at the facility to give away or adopt gently used items.

STREET SWEEPING

Part of the Highway Division's maintenance program involves cleaning the road surfaces and drains. The road surfaces and sidewalks are cleaned with mechanical sweepers during the spring months. The highly visible areas are cleaned first, such as the town centers and the Isaac Davis Trail. Most roads are swept once during this period.

Residents are reminded to NOT put lawn waste, trash, tree limbs, etc in the roadway during the sweeping process as it may damage the machinery. The operator will not remove such material, leaving an unsightly mess for you and your neighbors

The Department of Public Works would like to thank the residents for their continued cooperation during the winter months. It can be a challenging time for all.



MAILBOXES

The DPW asks that homeowners please check that your mailboxes and posts are secure and in good condition prior to the snow season. When installing a mailbox choose a suitable location. If you are unsure, check with the postal carrier. Mailboxes installed in the Town right of way are placed at the owner's risk. Each mailbox installation should be sufficiently solid to withstand snow-clearing efforts by the Town.

TRAFFIC ALERT

RIVER STREET FROM SCHOOL ST. TO CHADWICK ST. TO BECOME A ONE-WAY STREET, RIVER STREET ONE WAY

Starting May 1, 2023, River Street from School St. to Chadwick St. will become a One-Way Street.

Cars will no longer be allowed to travel from Chadwick St. towards School St. The Select Board approved this amendment to the existing Traffic Rules and Orders in June 2022.

Also starting May 1, the DPW crew will begin installing temporary physical barriers for pedestrians and cyclists along this section of River Street to provide a protected space for walking and biking.

In order to get to School Street, residents will have to use Chadwick Street.
