TOWN MANAGER'S UPDATE

Thank you for your patience while we work to make several improvements throughout town. In addition to the Kelley's Corner Infrastructure project, we also have the Town Center reconstruction project which has been progressing nicely. Paving is planned in the center for the week of June 12th.



I hope you noticed that we have restarted the Gardner Field project in West Acton, to completely rehab and revitalize the park. It will include a universally designed playground, which considers physical accessibility and sensory, cognitive, and emotional abilities to create an environment that is welcoming to all members of the community.

Additionally, I wanted to share some exciting staffing updates:

On June 5, 2023, James Cogan was sworn in as Chief of Police of the Acton Police Department. Chief Cogan started with the Acton Police Department in 1984 as a Patrol Officer, where he was a first responder to calls for service in the community and was promoted to Lieutenant in 2012 serving as the Special Services Division Commander, and then Deputy Police Chief in 2017. He served as Deputy Chief until he took on the role of Interim Police Chief in December 2022. Cogan received his Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice and Master of Science in Criminal Justice Administration degrees from Western New England College. In 2016, Cogan graduated from the FBI National Academy. He has also attended



numerous professional trainings such as Domestic Violence Advocate training.



On May 22nd the Select Board approved the appointment of Joanne Norton to serve as our Town Accountant. Joanne has worked in our accounting office for ten years as Payroll Coordinator, Assistant Town Accountant, and Acting Town Accountant. Joanne holds a Bachelor's in Accounting from Northeastern University and has completed several courses in the Massachusetts Municipal Auditors and Accountants Education Program.



In May we also welcomed our new Building Commissioner Ed Mullen. Ed is a Massachusetts Certified Building Commissioner with extensive experience in the construction industry and experience in municipal service both as a commissioner and as a locally elected official. He most recently served as the Director of Land Use & Buildings/Building Commissioner for the town of Littleton.

- If possible, please only make ONE trip to Hazardous Waste Day. Upon entering the site, please drive slow and stay in your vehicle.
- Please read the below lists of what to and not to bring. Many materials can now be dropped off year-round at Town of Acton facilities.
- Transfer Station sticker or recycling only sticker required to drop the below materials at the Transfer Station.
- Recycling sticker is only \$15 annually (\$10 for seniors 65+)

These collection services are for Acton residents only and proof of residency will be required.

WHAT TO BRING

Please bring household hazardous waste in sealed containers (use original containers when possible)

- Waste fuels, contaminated waste oil
- Engine degreaser, brake Fluid
- Transmission fluid, antifreeze
- Insecticides, weed killers, pesticides
- Wood preservatives
- Hobby supplies, artist supplies
- Photo chemicals, chemistry sets
- Cleaners, spot removers
- Swimming pool chemicals
- Aérosol cans

- Lithium ion, Nickel-Cadmium, Lead acid batteries (Transfer Station or Town Hall)
- Car batteries (Transfer Station)
- Hearing Aid (Button Cell) batteries (Town Hall)
- Sharps, Hypodermic Needles (PSF, Acton Nursing or Transfer Station)
- Fire extinguishers (Transfer Station)

WHAT NOT TO BRING

- Alkaline Batteries (dispose of in regular trash)
- Latex Paint (open, add hardener to expedite drying, throw away)
- Smoke Detectors (dispose of in trash)
- Asbestos (call a Licensed Asbestos Contractor)
- Compressed gas cylinders
- Ammunition, fireworks, explosives
- Commercial or industrial waste
- Infectious & biological waste
- Radioactive waste
- Oil filters (punch hole in dome, drain for 24 hours, save oil for recycling, put in trash after draining)

TO ENSURE SAFETY, PLEASE

- During event, drive slow and follow cones to avoid an accident.
- Tighten caps and lids leaving materials in original containers.
- Pack containers in sturdy upright boxes and pad with newspaper.
- Sort and pack separately: paint, pesticides, household cleaners.
- Avoid spills and do not place in a garbage bag.
- Never mix chemicals, and never smoke while handling chemicals.
- Pack your vehicle and go directly to the site.

The Town of Acton is seeking applicants for our new full-time position of Environmental Analyst. You will be working in our Sustainability Office with our Director making a difference in the town's environmental and sustainable impacts for a greener future!

General Duties and Responsibilities: This position will manage the Town's environmental compliance data analysis and reporting to support stormwater and water management goals, research and refine data sources and greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions modeling methodologies, and carry out other technical analyses related to energy use, transportation, nature-based solutions solid waste, and recycling. The analyst will work in the Sustainability Office and will assist the Sustainability Director and the Department of Public Works with administrative tasks, day-to-day operations, and data analysis to further progress the Town's sustainability goals.

Minimum Entrance Requirements: Bachelor's degree in Environmental Science, Energy, or Environmental Policy or other related field and course work in statistical analysis or five (5) years of increasingly responsible professional experience in environmental, sustainability, or municipal work or any equivalent combination of education, training, or experience.


Stories Connect Us An Acton Community Read Event


