Dear Residents,

I hope you're well as we step into the vibrant colors of October. Our community was impacted by fast-moving and damaging storm on September 8th. This storm caused thousands of power outages, dozens of road closures, and numerous emergencies. At one point there were more than 60 locations in town with power lines down impacting roadways. Thank you to our public safety dispatchers, firefighters, police, public works, building inspectors, and social services team members who worked around the clock to respond to the storm. I am proud of our how our employees responded and also how members of the community helped each other out during the storm and the days that followed. A month later our public works staff are still working to clear debris, repair sidewalks, and restore our town's infrastructure. Included below are a few photographs of that day.

ACTON BUSINESS ENERGY EFFICIENCY GRANT PROGRAM

Are you the owner of a business in Acton interested in reducing your energy use while increasing savings? Read on to learn more about the Acton Business Energy Efficiency Grant (ABEEG) Program!

ABOUT THE ABEEG PROGRAM

Acton's Select Board approved the use of **ARPA funds to support energy efficiency improvements for businesses** as part of the Acton Business and Energy Efficiency Grant (ABEEG) Program.

ABEEG will provide eligible business owners in Acton with reimbursement grants up to **\$2,000 to mitigate the financial impacts of improving the energy efficiency** of their physical location. The Town will allocate up to \$20,000 for this program.

HOW IT WORKS

Each business signs up for an energy efficiency audit from a Mass Save Sponsor (visit bit.ly/AuditReg). During an audit, energy efficiency experts assess energy use to provide customized recommendations for cost and energy savings.

Next, businesses apply for ABEEG at bit.ly/ABEEGapp to receive up to \$2,000 in Town funding.

Once selected energy efficiency upgrades are completed, businesses pay the cost in full and then send receipt of payment to the Town for reimbursement.

2 Apply for Additional Savings

Once you've signed up, apply for additional savings of up to \$2,000 through the Town by filling out the following form: bit.ly/ABEEGapp.

Applications are accepted on a rolling basis until October 25, 2023. Grant awards will be announced in the order that applications were received through November, 2023.




