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TOWN MANAGER'S UPDATE

As you may have heard, the Select Board is considering placing an override question on the April 30th Town Election Ballot. The Annual Town Meeting is one week after the election (on May 6th) and town and school leaders are preparing two budgets (referred to as "A" and "B" budgets) for Town Meeting. The "A" budget will make use of additional revenue available if the override question passes by majority at the Town Election, and the "B" budget will use only the revenue that is available within the constraints of proposition 2 ½. On January 22nd, I presented a revised recommendation for the FY25 municipal budget to the Select Board. The revision was based on direction from the Select Board to reduce our level services budget by \$1M. The capital plan was also adjusted to maximize investments based on prioritization discussions held by the Select Board. This revised budget also incorporated feedback received at the budget workshop from the Finance Committee and represents the current "A" budget proposal.

During the January 22nd Select Board meeting, the Board voted to approve and adopt a number of items that will have a positive impact to residents and town operations moving forward. The first was acceptance of an amendment to the general by-laws allowing for the regulating of Fossil Fuel Infrastructure in Buildings. This change is part of a pilot program Acton has been approved to join through DOER. Acton is one of 10 Commonwealth communities invited to join the program., which furthers the wishes of Town Meeting to further initiatives aimed at bringing Town-wide carbon emissions to zero as quickly as possible, with a target date of 2030. The second item was the approved adoption of an electric vehicle first policy, effective February 1st. This policy will require municipal departments to prioritize future procurement of vehicles by purchasing battery powered electric vehicles if available and suitable for the usage first; followed by plug-in hybrids; hybrid electric vehicles or other alternative fuel vehicles; and if none of these options exist for the intended usage and vehicle, than a standard vehicle powered by fossil fuels may be purchased. This policy and presentation can be viewed by selecting the image.



The Select Board also approved increases to Ambulance fees. The Town currently operates three levels of ambulance response: basic life support, advanced life support 1 and advanced life support 2. The changes to fees will bring Acton in line with surrounding communities and help increase revenues that will aid in offsetting the cost of operating these services.

Please join me in congratulating Christopher Sammet on his recent promotion to Deputy Fire Chief. Deputy Chief Sammet (photo to right) started his career as a Firefighter/EMT for the Boxborough Fire Department, before transferring to Acton Fire in 1998. More recently, he served the Acton Fire Department as Captain, overseeing training, conducting inspections, serving as incident commander, and aiding the Chief in transitioning the Department to Advanced Life Support. I am confident Deputy Chief Sammet will do a wonderful job in his new role.

This winter, take care of your landscape- and your watershed!


- Clear downspouts, gutters, and storm drains to allow melting snow to drain

NEED HELP PAYING YOUR ENERGY BILL?

Massachusetts' home energy assistance program (LIHEAP) helps eligible households pay a portion of their winter heating bills. No matter what type of heating source you have, and even if the cost of heat is included in your rent, LIHEAP might be able to help.

Home heating costs during the heating season (November 1, 2023 - April 30, 2024) may be eligible for LIHEAP.

Do I qualify?

- Eligibility for LIHEAP services can vary depending on income, household size, place of residence, and other factors.
- Households must meet 60% of state median income levels.
- The Council on Aging and the Community Services Office can help you determine if you qualify.
- Eligibility and benefit information is available online [here](#).

How does the program work?

Fill out a free application to determine if you are eligible. It doesn't matter if you own or rent - or even if heat is included in the price of the rent - LIHEAP may be able to help.

- The program provides a fixed amount for the cost of your primary source of heat, including (but not limited to) oil, electricity, natural gas, propane, kerosene, wood and coal.
- Payments are made directly to the heating company.

Acton Emergency Assistance Program

The Acton Emergency Assistance Program provides eligible Acton households with short-term financial assistance using grant funding from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). The program is intended to provide emergency assistance for rent, mortgage, utilities, (electric, natural gas, oil and propane) and childcare.
